STREET CLOSURES DURING SPECIAL EVENTS

Some streets may be closed to traffic during special events.

Pedestrian-only streets:

- The Village (May to September): Sainte-Catherine Street East, between Saint-Hubert Street and Papineau Avenue.
- Quartier des spectacles (May to September):
 - Sainte-Catherine Street West between De Bleury Street and Saint-Laurent Boulevard.
 - Jeanne-Mance Street and Balmoral Street between Sainte-Catherine Street West and De Maisonneuve Boulevard West.

SNOW REMOVAL

Parking is temporarily prohibited on streets for snow removal or during special events (road repairs, sports events, etc.).



The removable signs, usually orange, are attached next to existing signage. They take precedence over existing regulation, but do not cancel it out if the former is more restrictive.



Two other types of signs are used: sandwich boards placed on snowbanks and cardboard panels on poles that are stuck in snowbanks.

WHAT THE SIGNS INDICATE

Tour buses are identified by the term AUTOBUS TOURISTIQUE on parking signs.

Hours indicated on signs follow the 24-hour time clock; that is, 8 h 30 indicates morning and 20 h 30 indicates night.

Road signage and speed limits

As Québec follows the metric system, speed limits are indicated in kilometres per hour (km/hr) and gas is sold by the litre (l).

Right turn

Although right turns are allowed in most of Québec, they are prohibited on the island of Montréal.

Cell phones

Use of the “hands-free” feature on cell phones is prohibited while driving.
